COMPLETE GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION FOR 2010

● What is the *Fiber Arts* grant program?

The *Fiber Arts Program* provides financial assistance to individuals for projects that advance and promote the fiber arts. Grants of up to \$500 are available for projects that further the craft and engage the community, with activities taking place in 2010. Eligible activities include creation of new work, as well as teaching and/or documenting the fiber arts. Projects may involve any fiber art, with priority consideration for quilting.

This grant program exists to support professional fees for the artist, along with the cost of materials and supplies. Activities must take place in the ten-county greater Rochester region, including: Cayuga, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, Seneca, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates counties.

This program, administered by the Arts & Cultural Council for Greater Rochester, is funded and supported in partnership with the Genesee Valley Quilt Club, one of the oldest continually meeting quilt clubs in the nation.

● When is the Application Deadline?

Applications must be received – not postmarked – in the Arts & Cultural Council office not later than **5 PM on Friday, December 4, 2009**. Early submissions are encouraged. *Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.* Applications **WILL NOT** be accepted late, **incomplete**, faxed, e-mailed, or on disc.

● Is there a maximum funding amount?

YES. Grants will not exceed \$500. If the cost of your project exceeds that amount, you will need to demonstrate other sources of income.

● Who is eligible to apply?

- Artists of all disciplines, whose projects have as their core a focus on furthering the fiber arts, with a special emphasis on quilting.
- Individual artists, 21 years of age or older, who reside in the ten-county greater Rochester region, including: Cayuga, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, Seneca, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates counties.
- Artists who have complied with all reporting requirements of past Arts & Cultural Council grants.

● What materials must I submit?

Please submit 5 collated copies of the following materials:

Cover sheet
Application narrative
Budget
Artist resume or brief bio
Optional Supplementary materials, such as:
 letters of support
 artistic samples/photographs of previous work

How Should I Prepare My Budget?

Please determine the cost of your artist fee and any materials and supplies that you will need to carry out your project. If your project costs exceed \$500, you will need to include other sources of income. **Equipment should be rented, not purchased.**

Your budget must be balanced. Expenses must equal income.

● What will the panel consider?

The panel will make funding recommendations based on the following criteria:

- Degree to which project advances and promotes quilting or other fiber arts;
- Quality of engagement with community in artistic creation;
- Quality of proposed plan, demonstrating clarity, purpose, feasibility, and innovation;
- Clearly planned, **itemized** budget.

● How will I know if my project is funded?

The Arts & Cultural Council notifies all applicants by mail regarding the status of their applications. Checks are issued only after receipt of a signed contract.

● If I receive a *Fiber Arts Program Grant*, what my responsibilities include?

If you receive a grant you will be required to:

- Sign and adhere to the terms of a project contract.
- Credit the Arts & Cultural Council for Greater Rochester and the Genesee Valley Quilt Club for funding on all materials according to language used in the project contract.
- Send copies of promotional and advertising material regarding the project or event to the Arts & Cultural Council at least one month prior to the event
- Provide the Arts & Cultural Council with an advance schedule of funded events 4 to 6 weeks in advance of any funded event.
- File a final report within 30 days of project completion and no later than October 31, 2010
- The Arts & Cultural Council must approve any changes to your project including dates, times, and places where events are to be held. Requests for project changes must be submitted in writing and are subject to Arts Council approval.

● How do I fill out the Application Form?

Only typed or computer printed applications will be accepted. Hand written applications will not be accepted.

● Application checklist

Remember to put your name on each page of your application. Label all attachments with your name, address, and phone number. Incomplete or late applications will not be accepted.
